ISA CODE OF ETHICS
Arborists will:

1. Strive for continuous self development by increasing their qualifications and technical proficiency and by staying abreast of technical and scientific developments affecting the profession.
2. Not misuse or omit material facts in promoting technical information, products or services if the effect would be to mislead or misrepresent.
3. Hold paramount the safety and health of all people, and endeavor to protect property and the environment in the performance of professional responsibilities.
4. Accurately and fairly represent their capabilities, qualifications and experience and those of their employees and/or agents.
5. Subscribe to fair and honest business practices in dealing with clients, suppliers, employees and other professionals.
6. Support the improvements of professional services and products through encouraging research and development.

Observe the standards and promote adherence to the ethics embodied in this code.
